Kyoto

Kyoto conjures up images of sunlit walks around tiered pagodas and quiet lakes lined with cherry blossom trees—experience this scenery firsthand on your visit to the tranquil Gold Pavilion, a Zen Buddhist temple painted in delicate gold leaf. As the national capital for over a millennium, Kyoto offers you a unique glimpse into the history of Imperial Japan. Long rows of iconic vermillion torii (gates) lead to the inner shrine of Fushimi-Inari Taisha. Stone foxes, known messengers of Inari (the god of rice), can be found throughout the elaborate complex. Continue to the Kiyomizu Temple, an UNESCO World Heritage site constructed without the use of a single nail. On your visit to Nijo castle, wander through the Japanese cypress halls that the powerful Tokugawa shogunate called home.

Tokyo



Welcome to Tokyo, city of contrasts. Encounter the Imperial Palace's stately grandeur close to stories-tall jumbotrons, bound to wow even the most seasoned city-dwellers. See Harajuku's young denizens blaze a path for fashion lovers everywhere in this inimitable shopping district. Counteract the bustle of Tokyo's streets with a visit to the Meiji Shinto Shrine. Quiet and stillness reign inside the elaborate Inner Garden, a wooded oasis in the middle of the city. Make your way to the largest Buddhist temple, Asakusa Kannon. Here, restaurants, theaters and cinemas surround a five-story pagoda—a perfect symbol of Tokyo's enduring past and ultramodern future.

Hiroshima

On August 6, 1945, the city of Hiroshima experienced the terror of the world's first atomic bomb. Visit the Peace Memorial Park and the Peace Memorial Museum, which host several commemorative monuments designed to educate visitors about the tragedy this community underwent. Here, you can visit the remains of the Industrial Promotion Hall, which suffered direct impact and is now designated the Atomic Bomb Dome. The combined effects of the blast and the subsequent radiation killed thousands; here, you can read the names of every known bomb victim inscribed on the arch of the Memorial Cenotaph.
