Participate in an agricultural project such as harvesting potatoes




Visit an artesian market in Pisac

Every Service Learning Tour is unique.

To give you an idea of what your experience may be like, here's a glimpse into a recent tour to Peru:

- Students, along with their teachers, visited a high mountain community in the Chinchero region, worked with locals on agricultural activities and interacted with students and teachers for a full day at a local school
- The group visited the Larco Museum and three key Incan sites – Sacsayhuaman, Ollantaytambo and Machu Picchu—to learn about Peru's unique history
- At Pablo Seminario's ceramic workshop, the group learned about ancient techniques and modern investigations into working with local clay
- Students discovered how important weaving and textiles are in the community.
 First, they learned about traditional attire and the woven symbols. Then they worked with locals to dye materials, spin wool and weave textiles
