What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly overnight to India

Day 2: Delhi

– Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Delhi and experience an intriguing blend of history and modernity. During your visit you'll visit Old Delhi's 16th-century Jama Masjid, one of India's largest mosques. At the famous Raj Ghat, see the site of Mahatma Gandhi's cremation after his 1948 assassination. Later, continue to New Delhi; its tree-lined streets and orderly colonial buildings are a sharp contrast to bustling Old Delhi. Pass the Raj Path, a vast expanse of greenery, and see Connaught Place, the thriving business sector. You'll also visit Humayun's Tomb, which pre-dates the Taj Mahal, and Dilli Haat, a lively outdoor marketplace where bargaining is the name of the game.

Day 3: Delhi

– Take a guided tour of Old Delhi
– Visit Jama Masjid
– Visit Rajghat
– Visit Chandni Chowk Bazaar

Day 4: Delhi | Jaipur

– Take a guided tour of New Delhi
– Visit Humayun's Tomb
– Visit Dilli Haat
– See Qutab Minar
– Travel to Jaipur, known as the Pink City because much of the old quarter was once painted red, the Hindu color of hospitality. While here you'll explore the walled Palace of Amber, a noted example of Rajput architecture. Next, visit the magnificent City Palace, the principal residence of the maharajas. You'll also see the open-air observatory, Jantar Mantar, whose name means "Magical Device." Built in 1728, it was created to discover the mysteries of the cosmos. See the Palace of the Winds, which looks like a crown—its nooks and crannies provided places for women of the court to observe the busy streets below. In the evening, ride through the bazaars of Jaipur in a rickshaw and shop for souvenirs.
– Visit Jaipur bazaars

Day 5: Jaipur

– Take an elephant ride to Amber Fort
– Take a guided tour of Jaipur
– Visit City Palace
– Visit Jantar Mantar Observatory
– See Hawa Mahal
– Visit Jaipur bazaars on cycle-rickshaws

Day 6: Agra

– Travel to Agra via Fatehpur Sikri
– Visit the Taj Mahal. Among Agra's many fine examples of Mughal architecture, the Taj Mahal is without doubt the most fascinating. Built in an Islamic theme to represent paradise, the Taj Mahal was created by Shah Jahan as an eternal symbol of love for his favorite wife, Mumtaz Mahal ("Jewel of the Palace"), who died during childbirth. Be amazed by this marble structure adorned with precious stones brought in from around the world, including jade, crystal, mother-of-pearl, lapis and turquoise. The building appears to change color depending on the time of the day. Construction began in 1632, the year after Mumtaz Mahal died, and nearly 20,000 laborers completed the Taj Mahal in 1653.

Day 7: Agra

– Visit Agra Fort
– Visit a local school

Day 8: Agra | Delhi

– Return to Delhi

Day 9: Depart for home
