Leadership Conference

In San José you'll hear from world-renowned conservationist **Dr. Jane Goodall**, best known for her study of chimpanzees in Tanzania. She will be joined by **Severn Cullis-Suzuki**, an environmental activist who, at age 12, delivered a powerful speech that garnered worldwide attention at the 1992 Rio Earth Summit. Then, using design thinking—a creative problem-solving technique used by companies like Apple and Google—your international team will work to address an environmental challenge. The conference culminates with the Innovation Village, a showcase of student work where your ideas are shared and celebrated.




After the Tour


When you return home, the learning experience continues online with weShare, where you can reflect on what you learned globally and use it to impact change locally. You can even submit your project for high school and college credit.

Itinerary

March 15–23, 2015

Day 1: San José

Fly to San José and meet your Tour Director at the airport. Then transfer to your hotel, where you will settle for the night.

Day 2: Sarapiquí

Travel to Sarapiquí, where you will have the chance to observe Costa Rica's biodiversity—and practice your teamwork—while on a whitewater rafting adventure.

Day 3: Sarapiquí

Visit EARTH University, a school that offers a four-year undergraduate program in agricultural sciences and natural resources management. Established by Costa Rica law in 1986 as a private, non-profit international university, EARTH's 8,342-acre tropical campus includes laboratories and academic farms. Ever wondered how that bunch of bananas got to your local fruit stand or grocery store? Meet the people who plant, harvest and export those Fair Trade bananas

and learn more about how important peri-urban gardens are in building communities and economies.

Visit the Tirimbina Biological Reserve and see bats in their natural habitat during this activity. There are 113 species of bats in Costa Rica, which represents nearly 50 percent of the country's mammals. You'll learn about the natural history of bats, their classification, diversity and what threatens them, while also having the chance to observe, up close, bats that have been temporarily captured for research projects.

Day 4: Sarapiquí/Arenal region

Take a nature walk at La Selva Biological Station, the world's most popular site for tropical rain forest research. Situated on 15 kilometers of protected natural rainforest, the area averages over 13 feet of rain per year. Learn about the various research projects going on in La Selva and the array of flora

and fauna that you will see on your walk. Be on the lookout for poison-dart frogs, green iguanas and giant tropical ants on your guided walk. Then, travel to the Arenal region.

Day 5: Arenal region

One of Costa Rica's most spectacular waterfalls, La Fortuna is located within the thick jungle of the Arenal Rainforest. View spectacular biodiversity as you walk to the bottom of the waterfall. Then, change your perspective by taking a bird's-eye view of plants, animals and treetops on your canopy tour.

Cap your day's adventures by relaxing in hot springs. The Arenal Volcano not only serves as a watershed for Lake Arenal, but it also provides thermal energy for these naturally heated pools.

Day 6: San José

Travel to Sarchi, a small, picturesque town known for the brightly painted designs

and colorful wheels that adorn local oxcarts. Here you'll enjoy lunch before visiting Café Britt, a world-famous purveyor of coffee. Take a tour of the coffee plantation and enjoy a coffee tasting before continuing on to San José.

Days 7–8: San José

The **leadership conference** begins as you connect with students from all over the world in an inspiring and dynamic setting. Using what you learn from speakers and experts at the conference, combined with the experiences and knowledge you gained while on tour, you will collaborate using the design-thinking process to develop new ideas about environmental sustainability—ideas that you can bring back to your own community.

Day 9: Depart for home

Return home, prepared to solve environmental issues at the local level.
