# Itinerary June 20—29, 2015

#### Days 1-2: Helsinki

Fly overnight to Helsinki, Finland, and meet your Tour Director at the airport. Then, take a walking tour of Helsinki: Government House; Helsinki University; Uspenski Cathedral.

#### Day 3: Helsinki

Continue your discovery of the city on an expertly guided tour of Helsinki, including Parliament and the Olympic Stadium. Then, visit Temppeliaukio Church.

Visit the Finnish National Board of Education and learn how Finland has earned the world's top-ranked education system, according to a 2012 report by the Programme for International Student Assessment. The United States was 17th, just behind Belgium. Go behind the scenes at the agency responsible for drawing up the national core curricula to understand how it has achieved equality and excellence without selecting or tracking students during their common basic education. From its emphasis on early education

to a unique approach on teacher training, see what can be gleaned from this top-ranked system.

Tonight, you'll have a unique opportunity to visit a Finnish home and learn what life is like for a student after school, as well as why Helsinki was recently ranked the eighth best city in the world in which to live.

#### Day 4: Helsinki/Night ferry

Enjoy your final day in Finland's capital city. Did you know Finland, the birthplace of mobile phone maker Nokia and the open-source operating system Linux, has established itself as a hub of technological innovation over the past two decades? Helsinki is now one of the world's most connected cities, with 79% of its population on the Internet. Today you'll visit the Helsinki City Library, which received the first-ever Access to Learning Award from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation for its outstanding practices in increasing access for all people to computers and the Internet.

Enjoy some free time in Helsinki before you travel by night ferry across the Baltic Sea to Stockholm, Sweden.

#### Day 5: Stockholm

Arrive in Stockholm, the Swedish capital and home of the annual Nobel Prize festivities. Take an expertly guided tour of Stockholm, visiting Stockholm Town Hall. Then journey to the island of Djurgården to visit Vasa, a 17th-century war ship.

#### Day 6: Stockholm

Take a walking tour of Stockholm: Stock Exchange; Old Town; Royal Palace.

Meet with Swedish high school students and discover what it's like to be a teen in Scandinavia. Compare and contrast your day-to-day routines, your favorite classes, your extracurricular activities and your aspirations.

#### Day 7: Stockholm/Davos

Fly to Zurich, then travel to Davos, Switzerland, home of

the World Economic Forum's annual meeting, where business and political leaders discuss the world's most pressing issues. Get warmed up for the Student Leadership Conference later this evening with a cooperative, team-building activity.

#### Days 8-9: Davos

The leadership conference begins as you connect with students from all over the world in this inspiring and innovative setting. Over the course of two days you will hear from worldrenowned keynote speakers, work with local and global experts, and collaborate with peers in small international teams. You will be taught the design thinking process to develop solutions to some of the largest challenges we face and be inspired to take action when back home.
