

What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Belize

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport.

Day 2: Placencia Peninsula

- Travel to Placencia, a southern Belize peninsula that boasts 16 miles of white-sand beaches, charming lagoons, and mountain views.
- Visit Herman's Blue Hole National Park to explore the deep and extensive caverns of St. Herman's Cave and swim in its cool, glittering waters. With acres of jungle to explore, this is a great opportunity for bird watching.
- Visit the Garifuna Museum to learn about Garifuna culture and history through a multimedia exhibit.

Day 3: Southern coast

- Travel to Monkey River Village and enjoy a meandering boat ride along Monkey River, one of Belize's largest waterways. Then, hit the jungle trail in search of the howler monkeys whose deafening screeches can travel miles through the jungle's dense canopy. From here, take a refreshing dip in the river before traveling back to the village to meet locals and enjoy a traditional Belizean dish at a family-run restaurant.
- Continue on to the southern coast.

Day 4: Southern coast

- Explore Belize's barrier reef, which Charles
 Darwin once referred to as "the most
 remarkable reef in the West Indies." As the
 longest barrier reef in the Western Hemisphere,
 its vast ecosystem hosts everything from
 giant whale sharks to microscopic algae.
- Go snorkeling in the nearby Cayes.
- Interact with local Garifunas through a drum lesson and presentation about traditional Garifuna culture.

Days 5: Southern coast

- Visit the Maya Center.
- Visit a chocolate farm to explore the process of small-scale chocolate manufacturing.
 Learn how the business supports local cacao growers, Mayan communities, and sustainable agriculture through fine-tuned fermentation and drying techniques.
- Explore the Nim Li Punit ruins and imagine Mayan life as it flourished between the 5th and 8th centuries. With three plazas, several pyramids, and countless intricately carved stelae, the site is a testimony to the Mayan Classic Era's incredible civilization. As you walk through the site, keep your eyes peeled for the many elaborate headdresses atop each stela, a characteristic that gives Nim Li Punit the nickname "Big Hat."

Day 6: Belize City

- Travel to Belize City.
- Visit Cockscomb Basin Wildlife Sanctuary, the world's first internationally recognized jaguar preserve. Explore this spectacular natural site to see wildcats, tapir, deer, and many different types of tropical birds.

Day 7: Depart for home
