

Start by exploring what remains of the first European settlement on the Pacific coast at Panamá Viejo, then fast-forward to life in Panama today. Meet with a scientist at a tropical research center, travel to lesser-known Chitré to visit a local farm, and try your hand at pre-Columbian painting during a workshop with an artist. Then it's back to the city to marvel at the passage of ships through the locks of the Panama Canal and discover the region's flora and fauna in one of the lush parks that surround Panama City.



What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Panama City

 Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Panama City, Panama's cultural, financial, and political capital.

Day 2: Panama City

- During your time in Panama City, you'll visit the city's historic district, which dates back to 1519 when Panamá Viejo, or Old Panama, was the first Spanish city founded on the Pacific Coast of the Americas. In 1671, Governor Juan Perez de Guzman had the city set on fire before the attack and looting by the pirate Henry Morgan. Remnants are now part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site along with Casco Viejo, which was built on the rubble in the 17th century.
- Visit the Panamá Viejo ruins and museum.
- Take a tour of Casco Viejo.
- Visit the Biomuseo, where eight "devices of wonder" help tell the origin of the Panamanian isthmus and its gigantic impact on the planet's biodiversity.
- Explore the Amador Causeway on your own.

Day 3: Panama City

- Visit a tropical research center. Here, you'll participate in an interactive lesson with a scientist and learn about ongoing research.
- Visit a local fish market.
- Enjoy free time in Panama City or
- enjoy a boat ride on Gatun Lake.

Day 4: Panama City | Chitré

- Travel to Chitré, the capital of the Panamanian province of Herrera.
- Visit an area farm to learn about the agriculture of the Azuero Peninsula. Here, you'll try your hand at milking a cow and get the chance to feed some of the animals.
- Enjoy (and help prepare) lunch with locals.

Day 5: Chitré

- Meet local artisans and get a closer look at how they bring Panama's culture and traditions to life, blending the region's indigenous heritage with its European influences. Learn about the making of traditional Panamanian crafts such as devil masks, traditional drums, pottery, bread, and Pollera dresses.
- Participate in a pre-Columbian painting workshop.
- Enjoy a folklore dance show.

Day 6: Chitré | Panama City

- Travel back to Panama City.
- Visit the Miraflores Visitor Center and take an in-depth look at the Panama Canal, one of the most influential engineering projects ever undertaken and one of the seven wonders of the modern world. Completed by the United States in 1914, the 51-mile canal not only revolutionized international trade by bridging the Atlantic and Pacific oceans, it also signaled America's emergence as a global superpower. Learn about this modern marvel—including how 22,000 workers lost their lives during its 34-year construction—and see it in action at its Pacific entrance.
- Visit the Panama Canal Authority Administration Building.

Day 7: Panama City

- Visit Metropolitan Natural Park, a 573-acre park located in the center of Panama City.
 The park was created in 1985 and is home to many animals, including birds, monkeys, iguanas, and deer.
- Enjoy free time in Panama City.

Day 8: Depart for home
