In the final days of World War II, Japan was the target of the world's first atomic weapons. The bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki—along with decades of militarization and imperialism—have shaped Japan's future and its shift from military to technological might. Immerse yourself in a country devoted to rewriting its legacy as one of the world's leaders in international peacekeeping and technological innovation while exploring the imperialistic roots that led to these changes in national identity.

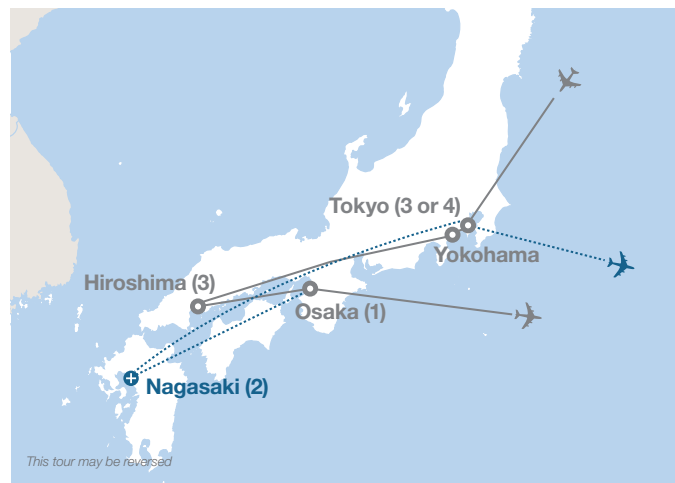

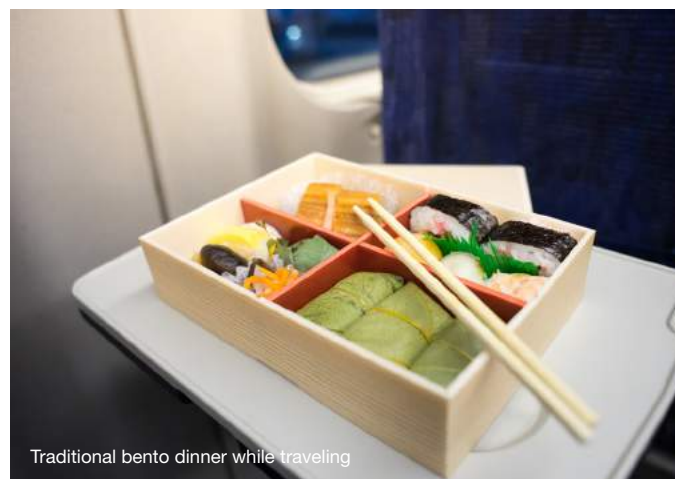

What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly overnight to Tokyo

Day 2: Tokyo

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Tokyo, city of contrasts.

Day 3: Tokyo

- Take an expert-led tour of Tokyo: Imperial Palace Plaza; Meiji Shrine; Harajuku.
- Enjoy free time for lunch in Harajuku.
- Visit the Yushukan Museum, the most famous Japanese military museum.
- Visit the Yasukuni Shrine, a controversial Shinto shrine that commemorates those who have died in service of the Emperor of Japan in the modern era.

Day 4: Tokyo

- Visit the Shitamachi Museum to see examples of daily life in the early 1900s.
- Enjoy free time to explore Tokyo or [☛ participate in a traditional tea ceremony.](#)

Day 5: Yokohama | Hiroshima

- Travel to Yokohama.
- Visit one of Yokohama's famous noodle museums.
- Tour Yamashita Park with your Tour Director.
- Visit the *Hikawa Maru*, an ocean liner turned World War II hospital ship that is now a museum.
- Board the bullet train, a perfect example of post-war Japanese innovation, and travel to Hiroshima.
- Savor a *bento* dinner, the classic traveling food of Japan.

Day 6: Hiroshima

- Tour Hiroshima with an expert local guide.
- Visit Hiroshima Peace Park and Memorial Museum for a solemn reflection on the events that ultimately ended World War II.
- Visit Miyajima Park and Itsukushima Shrine, a Shinto shrine dedicated to the three daughters of the god of seas and storms.

Day 7: Hiroshima

- Visit the Mazda Museum.
- Enjoy free time in Hiroshima.
- Dig in to a traditional meal.

Day 8: Osaka

- Travel to Osaka via bullet train.
- Visit Osaka Castle, a fully-restored castle constructed in 1597.
- Enjoy a boat ride in Osaka.
- Spend time seeing more of Osaka or [☛ learn to play a taiko drum.](#)

Day 9: Depart for home

Day 9: Nagasaki

- Fly to Nagasaki.
- Visit the Nagasaki Peace Park and Museum.
- Reflect on your travels and learn how to fold a paper crane.

Day 10: Nagasaki

- Tour Nagasaki with an expert local guide.
- Visit Glover Garden, a Western-themed garden and estate built for a merchant that helped modernize Japan's industries.
- Visit Dejima, a complete reproduction of the Tokugawa-era Port Nagasaki, the only harbor foreign ships were allowed to enter until the mid-1800s.

Day 11: Tokyo

- Fly to Tokyo.
- Participate in a calligraphy activity.
- Explore the Shibuya district of Tokyo.

Day 12: Depart for home
