What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Panama

 Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Panama City, a bustling metropolis nestled between the Pacific Ocean and a tropical rainforest.

Day 2: Panama City

- Visit the Panamá Viejo ruins and museum.
- Take a tour of Panama City. Visit the ruins of the first colonial settlement, dating back to 1519. Remnants are now part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site along with Casco Viejo.
- Learn about Panama's geographical history during a visit to the Biomuseo.
- Spend some free time on the Amador Causeway enjoying the city skyline.
- Participate in a local exchange.

Day 3: Panama City

- Explore on your own orenjoy a Gatun Lake boat tour.
- Take a hike in one of the parks that surround Panama City.
- Visit the Panama Canal Administration Building.
- Visit the Miraflores Visitor Center at the Panama Canal. Completed by the U.S. in 1914, the 51-mile canal revolutionized international trade by bridging the Atlantic and Pacific oceans. Learn about this modern marvel and see it in action.
- Explore on your own orenjoy a folklore evening.

Day 4: Panama City | Chagres National Park

- Visit Chagres National Park. This national park was established in 1985 to protect the Rio Chagres watershed, the primary source of water for the Panama Canal.
- Enjoy a canoe ride along the Rio Chagres as you make your way to the upper reaches of Lake Alajuela.
- Visit an Emberá indigenous village, where you'll learn about the culture and customs of the Emberá people. Discover their traditional dances and music, as well as their knowledge of local plants.

Day 5: Panama City | Portobelo

- Experience a snorkeling adventure during a day trip to the Caribbean coast.
- Visit the Portobelo Ruins.
