




THE SOUTH PACIFIC

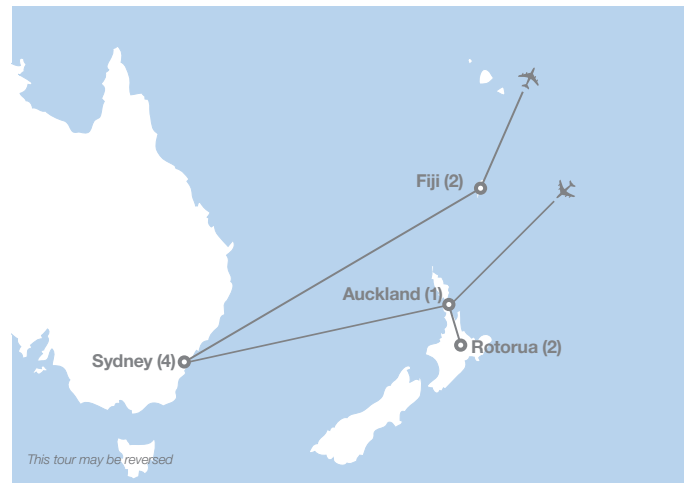

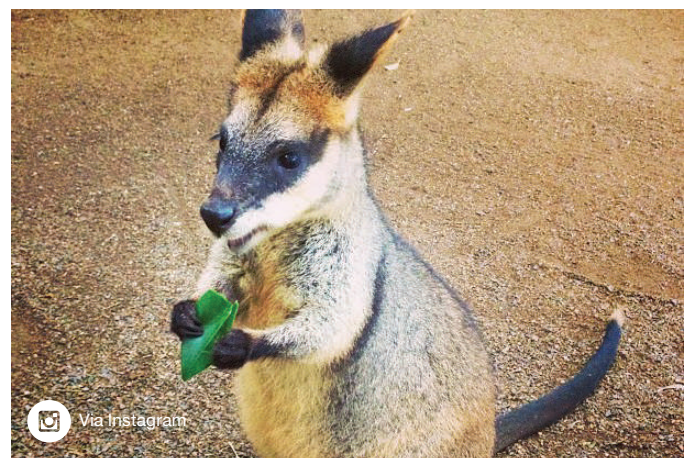

What you'll experience on your tour

Days 1-2: Fly to New Zealand

- Cross the International Date Line.

Day 3: Auckland | Rotorua

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Auckland.
- Travel to Rotorua, which has become a major travel destination thanks to geothermal activity and Maori culture. During your visit, hop on board an amphibious duck boat and explore Rotorua's historic landmarks and natural wonders. A local guide will lead you through the geothermal area, where you can marvel at bubbling pools of mud, crystal springs of hot mineral water, geysers, and richly colored craters. At a Maori village, you'll hear about Maori legends and tribal customs. Later, enjoy Maori song and dance at a traditional *hangi* dinner. And did you know that New Zealand is home to over 55 million sheep? Learn more during a sheep-shearing demonstration at the world-famous Agrodome. Then, cap off your visit with a ride on the Skyline Gondola.
- Visit the Agrodome.

Day 4: Rotorua

- Take a Rotorua Duck Tour.
- Visit Rotorua geothermal area.
- Visit the Maori village.
- Enjoy a *hangi* dinner.

Day 5: Rotorua | Auckland

- Ride the Skyline Gondola.
- Participate in an "Introduction to Jade in New Zealand" experience.
- Travel to Auckland.
- Take a tour of Auckland.

Day 6: Auckland | Sydney

- Fly to Sydney, a stunning, cosmopolitan city of 4.6 million people that boasts world-class beaches, iconic architecture, and breathtaking natural wonders. Enjoy a bird's-eye view of the city from the observation deck of Sydney Tower. At 1,063 feet, it's the second-tallest building south of the equator. Enjoy a new perspective of Sydney's waterfront from Circular Quay where you can snap a picture of the world-famous Sydney Opera House. Then, shop for souvenirs in the historic Rocks district. Situated in the shadow of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, this well-preserved colonial neighborhood marks the spot where Australia's first fleet of European settlers landed in 1788.

Day 7: Sydney

- Visit Sydney Tower.
- Take a tour of Sydney.
- Explore the Hyde Park Barracks Museum, a UNESCO Heritage Site, on a unique tour that brings students face-to-face with Australia's convict heritage.
- Enjoy an "Introduction to Opal in Australia" experience.

Day 8: Sydney

- Full day to see more of Sydney or
 - visit Taronga Zoo and the Sydney Opera House.

Day 9: Sydney

- Enjoy a free day in Sydney or
 - visit Bondi Beach for a surfing lesson or enjoy a guided tour of the area with a local expert.

Day 10: Sydney | Fiji

- Fly to Fiji. This South Pacific island nation is practically synonymous with "tropical getaway," as you will discover during your leisurely visit. Comprised of more than 330 islands, of which about a third are inhabited, Fiji was once known as Cannibal Isles because of its rather ferocious natives. First settled by the Polynesians, Fiji became a British Colony in 1874 before gaining its independence in 1970. Today its white-sand beaches, crystal-clear ocean waters, coral reefs, tropical rainforests, coconut plantations, and jutting volcanic mountains (some exceeding 3,000 feet) draw relaxation-seekers from all over the world.

Day 11: Fiji

- Spend your day with the local Nayawa community.

Day 12: Depart for home

- Recross the International Date Line.
